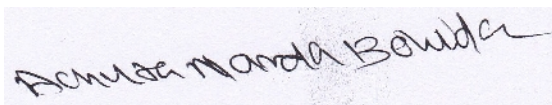

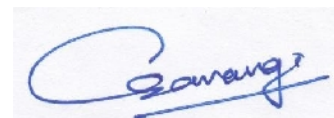

5. Evidence of Success: As a result of this practice, two compact areas of the college campus have turned green.
6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required: In summer season, due to scorching heat of this region, there is scarcity of water and the water level goes down. The college badly needs water resource to keep up the plantation.
